The problem: Why M&E, Why MERL?

Availability of Funding

- Foreign aid to South Africa has decreased over time
- Funding is available where to find it is not common knowledge
- Duration of funding is not cast in stone

Changing times

- Organisations are systems
- Contexts shift



Solution

Look at the work you do differently

Monitoring and evaluation is sometimes seen as a chore if it's seen as something imposed on you. However if it's part of what you do to improve, adapt to be more impactful it can a vital function in your organisation.

2. Defining M&E

"Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) is a **continuous management function to assess if progress is made in achieving expected results,** to spot bottlenecks in implementation and to highlight whether there are any unintended effects (positive or negative) from an investment plan, programme or project ("project/plan") and its activities." (FAO, 2023)

Monitoring and Evaluation for learning and performance improvement



Monitoring

What is **monitoring**?

"Monitoring is a process to periodically collect, analyse and use information to actively manage performance, maximise positive impacts and minimise the risk of adverse impacts." (Hall, Rogers & Moore, 2022)



Evaluation

What is <u>evaluation</u>?

"Evaluation is a systematic and intentional process of gathering and analyzing data (quantitative and qualitative), to inform learning, decision-making and action."





Operating cycles organisations follow








Results-based monitoring approach


Lean cycle



Resourcing Risks




- Not having the # of right people (staff compliment)

An example of the Allan Gray Orbis Foundation M&E approach



- 1. This approach follows the Deming Cycle of Plan-Do-Check-Act.
- 2.It follows lean philosophy on how to measure impact.
- 3. The M&E approach is also aligned to Planning, Monitoring, Evaluation, Research and Learning-which is a recursive process.
- 4. Phases 2 and 4 and fundamental to 3.1-3.5. This allows for greater information sharing and learning.

Making M&E meaningful to you...

Ask questions about recent reports


Oh, we didn't really collect any data on how our participous lives were changed. But we have loads of data about all the cool stuff we've done.





- What is the data saying, what does it mean for me
- What does it mean for the participants/communities we are meant to be serving, what does it mean in context?

Include M&E as part of your planning



- Consider the risks mentioned before
- Collaborate: opportunities may open up in terms of using the data to redesign, iterate, innovate and advocate for the problem your organization is looking to solve/fix

Include M&E as part of your Strategy





- Terms may be used differently within organisations/jargon terminology may be used in relation to M&E
- Focus on whether or not your organization is living up to its mandate/vision
- Focus on whether the problem its trying to solve is still the same
- Engage with your M&E data and look at it against your

Resource the M&E function



- M&E is usually seen as a person's job (which is mostly true when the incumbent and the function is new)
- Plan for growth (i.e. the M&E processes need budget)collecting the right data costs money, so too does evaluation and maintaining data

Share your learning




- This will encourage others to share their insights (breaking down silos)


- Provides a simplified view of a customers needs.

- Provides some direction into understanding the needs of customers and how they are best served.



- Provides insight into the emotions, rational thinking and motivation of customers.
- Useful for Programme Implementation Staff and Senior Leadership team.
- Useful when designing a programme, or collecting data to better understand the fit between programme theory and programme delivery.



- Provides and overall picture of how a business operates
- Useful for all stakeholders involved with programme delivery.
- Mainly those in a Marketing, Fundraising, Operations, Finance and Senior Leadership role.
- Useful when developing/
- reviewing strategy



Business Model Canvas also integrates various aspects of Monitoring and Evaluation that may be challenging to explain for stakeholders involved in implementing a programme and for those Evaluating a programme.
